

The meeting was called to order at 7:14 p.m. Board members present were Carissa Lovett, Katie Spicer, Lucinda Berry, Andrew Hoffman, Denise Prothero, Scott Bergeson, Kate Bergeson, and Ellen Lunsford. Amber Slaughterbeck, Morgan Chaney, and Eloise Bergeson were introduced as our guests.

The February minutes were approved; Lucinda made the motion and Andrew seconded. There were no March minutes due to not having a quorum at the March meeting.

Phil was not present, but sent the treasurer's report ahead of time; there is \$8,493.08 in the checking account, and \$2,924.11 in savings.

Conservation and Education report – The ISU Statesman Towers Peregrine falcons have re-nested in a different location and have a clutch of four eggs. It was also reported that White Nose Syndrome is now in Washington state. Bat populations seem to be stabilizing where WNS was first found in New York state, with the exception of a few types.

Recently completed events were Birding with WVAS on March 12th (Spring Migration Hike), the March 16th member meeting with Mark Booth Birds of Prey, and a field trip to Goose Pond on April 3rd, which included sightings of pelicans and an American Bittern.

The last board meeting date for 2016 is May 5th at the Grand Travers Pie Company. Member meeting dates remaining for spring 2016 are the April 20th (banquet) and May 18th (picnic) at Dobbs.

The next upcoming public events with WVAS involvement are Earth Day at White Violet Center at St. Mary of the Woods is April 16th and Emily's Walk at the Wabashiki wetlands on April 23rd in honor of longtime member Emily Herrington, who passed away late last year. April 30th is the bird feeder workshop at Dobbs; volunteers are still needed. The May bird count is May 14th, and the Midwest Bird Fest is at Hawthorn Parke on May 21st.

Eco-Logic in Bloomington, which has native plant sales and a new greenhouse, is open to the public from May 7th-June 18th, and could be a possible destination for a field trip.

Carissa is working on bird photos for the nature center. WVAS will have milkweed to distribute for a \$1.00 donation at various events.
